Luke 5:27-39

### Exploring the Scriptures

1. Levi's tax booth was on the shore of the Sea of Galilee, so he no doubt had heard Jesus' preaching and seen his miracles before being called (perhaps he even taxed the miraculous catch of fish). The Pharisees also heard and saw. To what do you attribute the different responses to Jesus?

2. Notice the insights about Jesus in Luke 4:36, 5:21 and 5:29-34. On the other hand, the Jewish leaders felt superior, were quick to judge others and kept away from undesirables. Clearly they were on a collision course (see Luke 6:11). Do you find in yourself a blend of Jesus' and Pharisees' mentality? If so, write down the problem areas and ask God what steps you can take to be more like Jesus.

3. Jesus said that he comes for the spiritually sick, not those who think they are healthy. Sometimes it's hard to admit our sickness, but what do the following verses say about our spiritual condition without Christ?

Romans 3:23

Romans 6:23

Romans 7:23

4. What can we learn from Romans 5:1-11 about what we gain when we surrender everything to Him?

5. Jesus refused to fit into the existing religious system and explains the reason in Luke 5:36-39. Read Romans 4:1-17 and Hebrews 8:7-13. Write down your thoughts about the differences between law and grace/faith. Is your life built on faith, or do you have a patchwork religion? How can you be more consistent?
