## Personal Growth Homework

Use this as a tool in your personal study throughout the week

**For the week of July 31, 2011**

Luke 7:1-17

### Exploring the Scriptures

1. In Luke 7: 3-8, the Roman centurion went from a general hope in God to faith that Jesus could help with his needs and finally to submission to Jesus' absolute authority. Where are you in this progression? Read Psalm 143:10, Matthew 6:10 and James 4:15, asking the Lord to guide you into full submission.

2. In Luke 7:6-8, the centurion shows the true insight of a disciple. Compare with Matthew 3:11, Luke 5:8 and 1 Corinthians 15:9. How does this help you define your position with Jesus and accept the fact that you may feel unworthy?

3. In the Gospels, we are told of only two occasions where Jesus was amazed: here in Luke 7:9 and in Mark 6:6. There are also two occasions when Jesus commended people for their great faith, here and in Matthew 15:28. In general, would Jesus be more amazed at your faith or lack of faith? If the latter, reflect on how can you strengthen that faith. See John 14:16-17, Romans 10:17 and James 1:5-6.

4. At the town gate of Nain, Jesus was moved with compassion for the widow (Luke 7:13). No one asked for a healing, thinking that things had gone too far for that, but out of love Jesus raised the son. Read the Matthew 9:36 and Mark 1:41 for other instances of Jesus' compassion. Do you still believe in his compassion when your prayers don't seem to be answered?

5. Both of this week's stories are about authority. In what other areas does Jesus have authority? (See Matthew 8:27, Mark 1:27, John 5:26-27, Colossians 1:18 and 1 Peter 3:22.) Do you feel that you are ready to carry out his orders?
