6. Hope for our broken lives (vs. 25-26)

Use these as a tool in your personal study throughout the week.

For the week of June 26, 2011

Luke 5:12-26

Exploring the Scriptures

1. Who are some of the social and physical “lepers” around you? What would it mean for you to touch them in Jesus’ name? Take a look at the following verses:

Psalms 82:3-4

Proverbs 14:31

Zechariah 7:9-10

James 1:27 and 2:14-17.

In light of those passages what actions am I going to take?

2. When the paralytic man was lowered into the room, Luke says that the power of the Lord was present for Jesus to heal the sick (Luke 5:17). See Luke 8:40-53, along with Acts 3:1-10 and 5:12-16. How do I expect God to be present in power during my prayers?

3. How did the following people respond to Jesus’ actions in that packed room: crowd, friends, paralytic, Pharisees? How does that reveal the condition of their hearts and their attitudes?

4. When looking at both stories that we discussed on Sunday, what characteristics do you see that they share, and what were the steps that led to healing in each case?

5. Despite the big crowds and popular acclaim, Jesus often withdrew to connect with His Father (Luke 5:16). Read Luke 6:12, 9:18 and 22:41 for some other times he did this. Amid this summer’s busyness, how am I going to slow down and find place to connect with the Father?
