- With His message

- In who he came for
Isaiah 61:1-2; 58:6
 - The poor
 - The prisoners
 - The blind
 - The oppressed
 - The unlikely
1 Kings 17, 2 Kings 5

- With the outcome **Luke 4:28-30**

An unpredictable response

1. Will I follow his example in spiritual practices? (14-16)
2. Will I learn from the familiar? (24)
3. Do I want to feel better or really get better?
4. Will I accept Jesus on his terms? (22)

Quick Review: Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there a particular point, verse or comment that caught your attention, challenged you or raised a question?

Connecting Questions

1. Jesus was a carpenter just like His father. What did your parents do for a living? Did you follow in the family business?

2. When Jesus attended the synagogue at Nazareth, the day's reading by divine "coincidence" proclaimed the Messiah. Have you encountered divine coincidences in your life? Can you recall a specific example?

Exploring the Scriptures

1. Jesus went to the synagogue on the Sabbath "as was his custom" (Luke 4:16). In such a small town, it most likely lacked great teaching or fine facilities. Why do you think he attended regularly, and what does that say about our own priorities and schedules?

2. When Jesus finished reading the words of the prophet Isaiah, the people spoke well of him (Luke 4:22). Yet a few minutes later, they were ready to kill him (4:29). What did they like about what he read, and what didn't they like about his later comments?

What do you think Jesus' intentions were when he was speaking in verses 23-26?

3. In what ways did Jesus fulfill the Scripture he read from the scroll (Isa 61:1-2), both then and today?

4. We learned this weekend that God often acts in ways that are unpredictable. What can we learn from the following examples?

Matthew 20:1-16

Luke 6:1-5

John 13:3-5

5. The people of Nazareth were more interested in Jesus' healing miracles than his teaching. Do we focus more on miracles or spiritual growth when we make our prayer lists?

What is the proper balance?
