Luke 12:49-59

Exploring the Scriptures

1. The angels announced peace on earth in Luke 2:14, and Jesus is called the Prince of Peace in Isaiah 9:6, yet in Luke 12:51 he says he didn't come to bring peace. How do you reconcile these statements? See John 14:27 & 16:33 and Romans 5:1.

2. Jesus pointedly illustrates the impact that following him can have on close relationships (Luke 12:52-53). In what way has your commitment to Christ affected relationships with your family or friends? Pray about how you might restore broken ties without compromising your core beliefs.

3. The people of Jesus' day were intensely interested in earthly events (Luke 12:54-56), but were missing the most important event in history. Today, many are passionately following celebrities' lives and sports statistics, but can't find enough time for prayer or Bible study. If you need to devote more time to God's kingdom, what steps can you take to make it happen?

4. In Luke 12:57-59, Jesus once again points out the importance of being reconciled to God. He encourages us to "settle out of court" before facing the Judge. Have you completely surrendered your life to the Lord, or are there areas you have not yet dealt with?
