Statement of Faith

Our early church leaders wrote the Apostle's Creed, to which we adhere.

We are staying connected with the historic teaching of the Christian church.

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended to heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen. At Seaside Community Church, we hold firmly to the truths of the historical Christian faith, including the following:

THE TRINITY: We believe there is one God, Creator, and Sustainer of all things, who exists eternally in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

THE BIBLE: We believe the Bible, in both the Old and New Testaments, to be the inspired Word of God and therefore the reliable authority for conduct and faith. We also believe Jesus is the Word of God made flesh as described in John 1:1-14.

JESUS CHRIST: We believe in the deity of Jesus Christ, in His virgin birth, in His sinless life and miracles, that He was The Word of God, that He was crucified to pay the penalty for our sins and was bodily resurrected on the third day.

THE HOLY SPIRIT: We believe in the present ministry of the Holy Spirit in the world to draw people into relationship with Christ and give believers the power to live godly lives.

THE CHURCH: We believe in the spiritual unity of all Christians as members of the body of Christ which is the Church. We follow Christ's two sacraments of water baptism and communion.

SALVATION: We have all sinned and fallen short of the glory of God and therefore needs to believe and receive Christ's death on the cross as the sole and complete payment for their sins. There is no other way to salvation except through Jesus Christ.

THE FUTURE: We believe in the personal return of the resurrected Jesus to establish His kingdom forever. Those who have accepted Christ will experience eternal life with Him, while those who have rejected Him will suffer forever apart from God.

Instead, we will speak the truth in love, growing in every way more and more like Christ, who is the head of his body, the church. EPHESIANS 4:15 Spiritual growth is a process that never ends. The goal of spiritual growth and Christian maturity is becoming more like Jesus. To encounter Him, to know Him, and to reflect Him is our aspiration. A. What is the meaning of Baptism?

For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures. 1 CORINTHIANS 15:3-4

For when you were baptized, you were buried with Christ, and in baptism you were also raised with Christ. COLOSSIANS 2:12

B. Why would I be baptized?

• Because it identifies me as a follower of Christ.

Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." MATTHEW 28:18-20
